- Obtaining a good score on the IELTS test is required for almost all students applying to Anglophone universities (U.S. U.K. etc)
- The Anglophone Section proposes 12 hour workshops for students in 1ère and Term.
- Intense preparation including two full, corrected Mock Tests
- These usually take place during the first two and half days of vacations and cover the four assessed skills (Reading, Listening, Writing, Speaking) of the IELTS exam. The cost is 275 euro.
